



2016 Cape May Birding Trip

Join Somerset County Park Commission Naturalists on a South Jersey birding adventure! We will be traveling by van to explore the New Jersey/Delaware Bayshore from Fortescue to Cape May.

May is the perfect time to visit this biologically rich area; during migration many rare species like Ruddy turnstones and Red knots make stop-overs on their long migrations. In the spring there is another special natural phenomenon that occurs along the Delaware Bayshore, the spawning of Atlantic horseshoe crabs. While quite a sight to see, the presence of the spawning crabs and their resulting eggs is essential to the success of many migratory species.

We will be staying at a hotel on the beach with great views and continental breakfast. The hotel is within easy walking distance of many restaurants, cafes and delis. We will make 'happy' stops each day for the purchasing of lunch, drinks, snacks and so forth. The cost of participants' meals is their responsibility.

This trip is for active adults and seniors with an interest in bird watching and or wildlife photography. We will be taking between 10 and 17 participants on this adventure.
