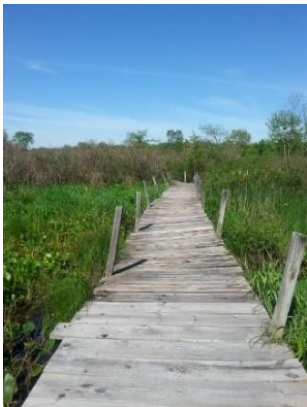

The Somerset County Park Commission Environmental Education Center is located within Lord Stirling Park in Bernards Township, New Jersey. Nestled within 500 acres of the western portion of the Great Swamp, over 9 miles of trails consisting of 4+ miles of boardwalk trails and footbridges are open to the public for passive recreational use such as hiking, jogging, and bird watching. The Environmental Science Department oversees the park and conducts hundreds of programs each year for schools, families, individuals, and organizations interested in environmental education.
